Introduction



There are 2 ways to vote:

- in a polling station
- by post

There have been some changes to how elections are done:



You must bring identification ID - to the polling station

- To vote by post, you need to provide your signature, date of birth and National Insurance number



 There is more help for disabled people in polling stations



Register to vote

You must register if you want to vote. There are 2 ways to do this.



1) Register online



You will need your National Insurance number to fill in the online or paper form.

Voter ID



ID means **identification**. You must bring ID when you vote.



This could be

- passport
- photo driving licence
- bus pass
- blue badge
- work permit or National ID card
- defence veteran photo card



If you don't have any of these things, apply for a free **Voter Authority Certificate** online:



Accessibility in polling stations


We help people to vote in lots of ways, including
